About Life Healthcare Nursing Education Trust

The Life Healthcare Nursing Education Trust ("Trust") was established in 2017 to address the nursing shortage in South Africa by speeding up social development. The Nursing Trust is a broad-based ownership scheme (as described by B-BBEE codes) with the objective to fund and maintain bursaries for the benefit, empowerment, and upliftment of nursing students from disadvantaged communities. Since its inception, 48 students have benefited from the programme.

Ensuring Nurses For The Future

The Nursing Trust was created to address the shortage of nurses in South Africa by ensuring the steady supply of nurses in the healthcare system. In essence, the Nursing Trust is a national initiative that seeks to create a pool of future healthcare givers to uphold a sustainable, quality nursing system.

As a registered public benefit organisation (PBO), we offer bursaries to young men and women who aspire to be nurses. The bursaries include funding for their tuition, accommodation, and meals at the tertiary institutions where they are stationed. Following their graduation, they perform community service for a period of one year at a public health facility, as defined in the relevant legislation.

The Nursing Trust benefits from collaboration with the Life Healthcare Nursing College. As such, the Nursing Trust students are included in college activities such as:



Induction sessions for the new students



Contact sessions with current students



Follow-up and recruitment programme for graduates who have completed their community service



How The Trust Operates

The beneficiaries of the Nursing Trust are South African citizens who wish to obtain a nursing degree. South African nurses, from disadvantaged communities, are eligible for the bursary if they have proof of registration at an accredited higher nursing educational institution. As aligned to South African Nursing Council Regulation R.174, the Nursing Trust awards bursaries against qualifications such as the bachelor's degree in nursing and midwifery.

The Costs Covered By The Bursary Include:

- Tuition fees for each year of the nursing programme
- Accommodation and meals at the university residence
- The cost of prescribed textbooks
